Women and Girls in the CARICOM

Population

Slightly more women than men in the population

Education

 More women and girls (than male) completing secondary education and graduating from tertiary education institutions

Poverty

Women and girls are among the poorest

Employment

- female unemployment is higher than male unemployment in spite of higher educational levels among women
- More women than men employed in low paying jobs

Drug Use Among Women: Influencing Factors

- Factors intrinsic to the individual woman
- Family Factors
- Social and environmental factors
- Life stresses/relationship issues
- Peer pressure
- Substance use/abuse as a coping mechanism

Vulnerabilities

Special Vulnerabilities

- High level of domestic violence perpetrated among women and children
- Double burden of work in public and private domains
- Higher rate of increase in the disease of drug use disorders among women
- Drug use under reported
- Few treatment facilities

Barriers for Seeking Treatment

Availability and Access

 Fear of losing custody of children/Lack of child care services support

Cultural barriers

Where are we in CARICOM?

- Strengthening human, technical, and institutional capacity to address drug use/addiction
- Prevention programmes targeting schools and communities
 - Reducing vulnerabilities/building protective factors
 - School Drug Policy

- Treatment and Rehabilitation
