Implications for Alternative Development

- AD must take into account prevailing gender-roles
- Livelihood analysis is a gender-sensitive tool that facilitates a basis for the design and monitoring of development measures

Instruments: Livelihood analysis in a drugs environment

- Quantitative socio-economic data
- Qualitative data on household livelihood assets (capital)
- Rural income and incentive structures
- Gender aspects
- Institutional landscape

Identify the roots causes of illicit drug crop cultivation and sustainable livelihood options

- Understand rural livelihood systems from a gendersensitive household perspective
- Which role does illicit drug crop cultivation play for livelihood systems?
- How to promote existing local livelihood assets and strategies in order to deliver sustainable livelihood opportunities?

- Gender-sensitive and semi-standardised household surveys
- Focus-group interviews with women and men
- In-depth interviews with selected households
- Expert interviews
